

The regular Township meeting was held on September 7, 2021, at 7:00 PM. It was called to order and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Roll Call of Officers

Supervisors, George Henry, James Callahan and Kenneth Wertz were present. Sec-Treasurer Beverly Henderson, Engineer Thomas Levine, Solicitor Matthew Gieg were present. Assistant Secretary Robbin Grove was absent.

#### Minutes

A motion was made by James Callahan and second by Kenneth Wertz to accept the meeting minutes of August 3, 2021, as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by James Callahan and second by Kenneth Wertz to accept the Treasurer's report as presented for the month of August. The motion passed unanimously.

#### New Business

- Sewer Authority - A motion was made by James Callahan and second by Kenneth Wertz to adopt Ordinance #20210907-A, known as the amendment with the Secretary of the Commonwealth of PA to form an Authority to extend the existence of the Frankstown Township Sewer Authority for an additional 50 years. The motion passed unanimously.
- Mutual Aid Agreement - The Insurance Company had requested a mutual aid agreement between the Frankstown Township Fire Police and the Geeseytown Fire Company to have the Fire Police covered under the Fire Company workers comp plan.
- County Bridge located on West Loop Rd - Agreement of Sale will be signed by the Commissioners; Settlement Statement will be signed by the Commissioners; Temporary Easement will be signed by the Commissioners; Deed will be signed by the Township.

A motion was made by James Callahan and second by Kenneth Wertz authorizing the execution of the deed as the grantee. The motion passed unanimously. The deed is normally signed by the County and then the County turns it over to the Township, however they were hoping to skip this step by having the Township sign the deed. The Board was a little hesitant to sign for fear that the County would then assume the Township will need to maintain the Bridge, however Mrs. Nicole Hemminger (Blair County Chief Clerk) assured the Board it will maintain a County Bridge.

#### General Comment

- Lynn Granville questioned why the manholes were popping along Brush Mountain Rd the day that Ida moved through. Mr. Granville assumed all the work that was done on Godfrey Lane would have fixed this problem. Engineer Levine stated that with 5+ inches of rain, if it can't find its way to the ditch and/or the river, it would need to find somewhere to go and it would end up in the sewer line. The ditches held the water with all the rain and the ditch work that they did behind Mr. DeStefano's worked as well. The water did not cross the road at the intersection of Godfrey Lane and Scotch Valley Rd.

- Nicole Hemminger, a resident, wanted to thank the Board for replacing the inlet grade at her residence located at 409 Brush Mt. Rd.
- Supervisor Henry told Mr. Granville that he doesn't think with he will get water on his property once they do the ditch work off Elm St.

With no other business before the Board of Supervisors, a motion was made by James Callahan and second by Kenneth Wertz to adjourn the meeting at 7:30 PM. The motion passed unanimously.
