

The Township meeting held on March 3, 2015 at 7:00 PM was called to order and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call of Officers

All members were present; Sec-Treasurer Beverly Henderson, Solicitor Frederick Gieg, Atty. Matthew Gieg, Twp. Engineer Thomas Levine, Sewer Engineer Christopher Dutrow were present.

Minutes

A motion was made by James Grove and 2nd by Kenneth Wertz to accept the meeting minutes of February 3, 2015 and the Treasurer's Report for the month of February as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

There was no public comments or announcements.

Old Business:

Sylvan Hills Phase 3 Sewer Replacement – Engineer Dutrow Stiffler McGraw & Associates was present to present the Sylvan Hills Phase 3 Sewer Replacement, which will intale Sylvan Heights Drive, Sylvan Drive and Larch Street. Penn Dot is planning on replacing the Stormwater and paving the roads in question, therefore the Board of Supervisors thought it would be a good time to replace our sewer lines. A motion was made by James Grove 2nd by Kenneth Wertz authorizing Stiffler McGraw & Associates to proceed with the advertising to receive bids to be opened at the April 7, 2015 meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

Engineer Dutrow had also requested a motion authorizing the Chairman to sign the application for Penn Dot to request a HOP permit. A motion was made by James Grove and 2nd by Kenneth Wertz authorizing Chairman Henry to sign the Application for the HOP. The motion passed unanimously.

Engineer Dutrow also reported that Sylvan Hills Phase 2A will be started next week due to the weather conditions...

Pauline Woomer Subdivision – Due to the fact that the easement needed for this subdivision was not signed. A motion was made by Kenneth Wertz 2nd by George Henry to table the Woomer Subdivision until the April Meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

New Business;

Mr. Bill Straesser was present on behalf of Congressman Bill Shuster to see if there is any issue or concerns that the Township may have, one thing that was brought up was EPA and how they are governing the MS4 regulations.

Solicitor Gieg reported that there were 5 complaints filed to end sewer service to homes that have a large outstanding sewer bills.

Solicitor Gieg also reported that there were liens placed on several other properties where the customer was delinquent on their sewer bill.

A motion made by James Grove and 2nd by Kenneth Wertz to adjourn at 7:31 PM. The motion passed unanimously. The Board retired into an executive session for personnel.
