

The regular Township meeting was held on November 4, 2020, at 7:00 PM. It was called to order and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Roll Call of Officers

Supervisors, George Henry, and Kenneth Wertz were present. Sec-Treasurer Beverly Henderson, Solicitor Christopher Jancula, and Engineer Levine were present.

#### Minutes

A motion was made by Kenneth Wertz and second by George Henry to accept the meeting minutes of October 6, 2020, regular meeting as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

#### Announcements:

#### General Comments

- Liz Plummer was present concerning the trash all over the place at her neighbor's ground. According to Ms. Plummer, she had a dumpster there however; she feels she cleaned out trash out of her house and not along the roadway. Since notice was given to Ms. Weidenbacker, the next step would be to file a Magistrate Action against her. Kevin Cramer as the Zoning officer has the power to file the action. Kevin is out on Medical leave and due back soon. The District Magistrate does not have the power to make her clean up only to fine her. The Court of Common Pleas would have the power to make her clean up, however Ms. Plummer would have to testify.
- Judy Roberts was present concerning her new neighbor and the loud parties that have been going on since they moved in. Ms. Roberts stated that the attendees are parking on Roberts Drive, which is a private road. The residents of what was once Cherry St. approached the Township to take over the roadway; however, it was not wide enough to qualify to be a Township road. Ms. Roberts stated that there are strobe lights and boom boxes into the wee hours of the morning. Solicitor Jancula asked her if she called the state police when they were partying. She said they told her it was up to the Township. Mr. Roberts also claimed that the house he lives in was once on fire and when they rebuilt the house, they moved the driveway from Overlook Dr. to Cherry Street. She stated that the Township let them move the driveway. Engineer Levine stated if they moved it, it was on them. It does not matter to the township because it is a private road. Ms. Roberts stated that the township needs to put a noise ordinance in place. She recognizes that the farmers would have to be exempt from this ordinance. Supervisor Henry stated that would then become spot zoning and we are prohibited from spot zoning. As she was leaving she stated, as always it wasn't a pleasure.
- Lynn Granville stated that he might not have any access at all to that lane. If Ms. Roberts would hire an attorney, they would not have any means to that roadway since it is private and his access was off of Overlook Drive.

- Lenny Metz had nothing at this time.

#### Old Business

- Solicitor Jancula stated that a letter was drafted to Mr. Lenny Metz concerning cleaning up the roadway leading to his neighbor's house. Mr. Metz stated that they are working on it, his son Matt junks in the wintertime when he is laid off and he should be getting laid off soon. Mr. Metz was requesting more time to get the mess cleaned up. The Board advised Mr. Metz to continue to clean up the junk.
- Solicitor Jancula stated he received a letter from Attorney Imler who is representing Harry Chapple and stated that his ground is cleaned up and would like for the Township to withdraw their action against him. The Board is waiting for Kevin Cramer return to review and advise the Solicitor.
- Solicitor Jancula has sent out a letter to the owners of the rooster that keeps crowing on Brush Mountain Road without any response. The letter stated he has 10 days to get rid of the rooster only to find out there are ducks there too. Solicitor Jancula stated he gets an email daily. Supervisor Callahan will be asked to keep an eye on it until Kevin Cramer returns.

With no other business brought before the Board of Supervisors, the meeting adjourned at 7:53 PM with a motion made by Kenneth Wertz and second by George Henry. The motion passed unanimously.
